

The Most Southern Ordinary Tour

– Approx 245km over 6 days

Cost per rider \$600 includes food, accommodation, and back up vehicles. We are in the process of fundraising which will bring the cost down.

Accommodation will be in back packers, or holiday camps – towels and bedding provided.

Saturday and Sunday

Tour leaves Saturday morning from Oamaru and drive to Bluff. We then catch a ferry to cross the Foveaux Strait to Stewart Island, where we will spend two nights. The bicycles will travel with us, so a great opportunity to cycle around Stewart Island on the Sunday. There should be time for those that are interested to take a trip to Ulva Island Open Sanctuary.

Monday

Monday morning we return to the Mainland to start the cycling back towards Oamaru. A short cycle, on the first day of approx 30km from Bluff to Invercargill where we overnight. There maybe a side trip to Oreti Beach where Burt Munroe spent time perfecting his race times on his Indian cycle. We can try for the Fastest Ordinary.

Tuesday

Tuesday we set off to Fortrose (45km) for lunch. Cycle to Waiakawa (43km) or onto Curio Bay (48km).
Rolling countryside on this leg.

Wednesday

Tuesday we depart from Curio Bay and head to Papatowai for lunch (43km). After lunch we head to Owaka (26km). This day will be a little more challenging than the previous day.

Thursday

The last day of the journey. We leave Owaka and head to Kaka Point for lunch (24km) and then onto Balclutha (21km). After a quick explore around the township we load up and head back to Oamaru in time for the Oamaru Victorian Heritage Celebrations. For those who are interested in staying
